AUTISM: WHAT WORKS – AND WHY?

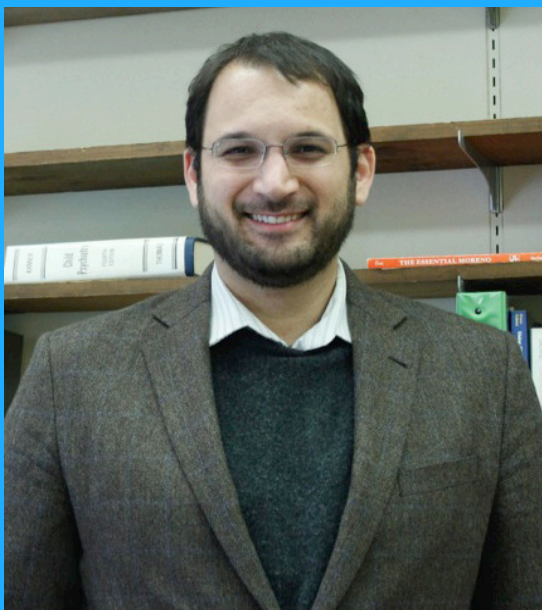

What intervention best helps a person on the autism spectrum? Recent reports of children moving clear off the spectrum encourage hopes that the right therapy can make a huge difference in outcome.

Dr. Matt Lerner's Social Competence and Treatment lab is developing innovative tests of a person's social abilities – for instance how efficiently they process a facial expression or tone of voice. The lab then uses insights from those tests to design better, more targeted treatments, building a direct bridge between science and practice.
