Social Superheroes Study

The **Social Competence and Treatment Lab (SCTL)** at **Stony Brook University** is conducting a research study, *Superflex Series Pilot Study*, to learn more about how the Social Detective/Superflex curriculum can help youth with autism with their social-emotional learning (e.g., self-awareness, social-awareness, self-management, decision-making, and relationship skills).

This study will help us to create more effective and precise treatments for youth with autism while learning about the implementation of the Social Detective/Superflex curriculum.

You and your child may be a good fit for the study if...

- You have a child with autism
- Your child is in the 2nd, 3rd, 4th or 5th grade
- You and your child both speak English fluently



Activities for the study include:

- Participation in one of two social-emotional groups (1.5 hours, once a week, for 25 weeks) at the SCTL at Stony Brook University. The specific social-emotional group your child would participate in will be determined by chance.
- 4 in-lab visits, totaling about 6 hours.
- o Parents/caregivers and children will each complete questionnaires and activities.
- Children will also complete in-lab computer activities while wearing an electroencephalogram (EEG).

By participating in this research study, your family will receive:

- A free individualized clinical assessment report of the study's standardized measures, if you so choose.
